President's Report (Anne/ Seema)

- 1. Quick Intro of the board members.

- 3. Support migrant families at Greeley School list of supplies and Amazon wish list was sent from Ms. Proudfoot. All items were purchased except for socks. May need volunteers to assemble backpacks. They plan to get the backpacks to Greeley school next week. Toiletries and household items can be taken to Alderman's offices as well.
- 4. Looking for a Volunteer Coordinator to organize opportunities expected commitment is 2 hours a month. Looking at the 4 people who have signed up to help in the last month. Sarah Sommerfield volunteered to coordinate volunteers! Thanks Sarah!
- 5. Room Reps had a party this week at the Optima Lakeview. Mr. Hill has room reps! Shoutout to Sarah and Cathy for getting room reps together. Still need one 6th grade room rep.

Community Events (Christina/ Jessica)

- 1. Walk & Roll to School Day debrief: 100 families attended! A lot of families walk. Bike rack coming, waiting on CDOT. The kids enjoyed the obstacle course on the front playlot afterschool. It was a little windy, but the kids had fun.
- 2. Teacher Conference Lunch (10/26) they will look at the volunteer list. Waiting for the district to tell us the times for lunch, noon or 3pm. Will reach out to the room rep team to ask for volunteers for setup/cleanup. Looking at new food options, besides D'Ags. Teachers don't complain about free food (Marburger).
- 3. Open Gym (12/9, 1/21, 2/10, 3/10): Keep the gym open for people to come, Ms. Gereaux working on some fundraising for coaches. Looking at donations to go towards this.

- 4. Parents Night Out thinking about partnerships with Mr. Lopez.
- 5. Grade-specific events email for room rep team to email the grades Cathy to alert the room reps NPTO will fund one event for the year per grade up to \$499. Keep it to one transaction for ease of accounting.
- 6. Principal Appreciation Week (10/16-20) (Kelly) Collected hearts from about half the classrooms and a few more coming in. She will reach out for volunteers to assist with the balloon volcano installation on Sunday.

Communications Update (Erika/Kim)

- 1. Fundraising communications strategy: Stop messaging families after they have donated. Segmentation breakdown on last year's donations (\$10-10,000). Maybe we can ask them to donate +\$10 from whatever they donated last year. 30+ people who have wanted to volunteer and need to find a way to get them activated.
- 2. Community feedback: Curriculars and Lunch is what people want to talk about. Why don't people take free lunches? How can we destigmatize school lunch? Everyone in CPS gets free lunch and free breakfast.
 - (Marbuger): We are back with Aramark vendor this year, kids seem to like the food better.
 They are taking feedback. Marburger and Muhammad are working with a student council feedback group lunch came up as an option. Student's interest in improving school lunch.
 More kids than ever are eating the school lunch.
 - Pre-K Mom: Question to Marburger: Have students do food reviews? They can hear it from their peers how good the food is.
 - (Marburger) We have morning announcements. We can move to having a recording of students.

Fundraising (Shannon/ Marc)

- 1. Helping Hands runs Monday 10/16 Friday 11/17- goal of \$150k for tech and teaching positions. What we do with donations from families and the community can be seen at NettelhorstPTO.org. Last year we raised about \$130k. Distribution of donations are wide (\$10-10,000). Some people donate their time, and their skill sets. Graphic designing, accounting, etc. Strategy for getting out word on Helping Hands and Parent Party? Email, social, newsletter? More requests for individual skills for auction? How do we reach more people to maximize donations?
- 2. Nettelhorst yard sign sales in mid Nov before Thanksgiving break will have volunteer sign up for four time slots before/ after school. Two sided foam board, can go in a yard or in a front window. They will go to Helping Hands donors of a certain level, and also sell them after school. We will have our brand recognized in the neighborhood.
- 3. Assemble the Parent Party committee in late October anyone interested in event planning, design, auction, teacher liaison should join meet once a month and setup Friday before the event! 8-10 people to assemble the parent and staff party. Need to bring LSC for approval. Tentative date is Saturday, February 24th, 7-10pm. Anyone interested in event planning, auction, liaison with teachers on auction items, decorating, fundraising, etc should reach out to Shannon to be part of the committee.
